

HOTEL MEN IN GOLF TILT.

Stevens and Hall Lead in Tourney on Rye Course.

The first annual golf tournament of the Hotel Men of the United States was played yesterday over the South course of the Westchester-Biltmore Country Club at Rye. Sixty-four hotel men from various parts of the country, took part in the tournament, which was a handicap affair.

The low gross score of the tournament was 85, made by R. F. Stevens of Lake Placid, N. Y., and Fred C. Hall of Montclair, N. J. Mr. Stevens also had the low net score, 65. He chose to accept the Bowman cup, a silver trophy offered by John McE. Bowman which was the most sought for prize of the tournament. The name of the winner is inscribed on the trophy and a replica given to him. Three victories will gain permanent possession of the trophy.

Mr. Hall thereupon became the winner of the President's cup, a bronze trophy offered by Elmore C. Greena of Buffalo, President of the New York State Hotel Men's Association. There were about fifteen other prizes for low net scores.
