

ALLENHURST GOLFER LEADS HOTEL MEN

Bloomfield Hullick Wins Low Net Prize in Tourney at Westchester-Biltmore.

Bloomfield Hullick of Allenhurst, N. J., won the low net prize in the hotel men's golf tournament at the Westchester-Biltmore Country Club yesterday. The handicap medal round preceded a testimonial dinner given to John McE. Bowman by the hotel men from all parts of the country.

The winner of the low gross prize was Raymond Stevens of Lake Placid, who played from scratch and turned in a card of 85, the best of the day. A hundred golfers took part in the contest on the south course.

Simeon Ford played around in 107 strokes, and had a handicap of 18, which was not sufficient to get him in the prize list. Simeon explained that the poor brand of golf was due to the fact that he was preparing an after-dinner speech for the evening, and as it was his first offense in eight years he felt like a June graduate.
